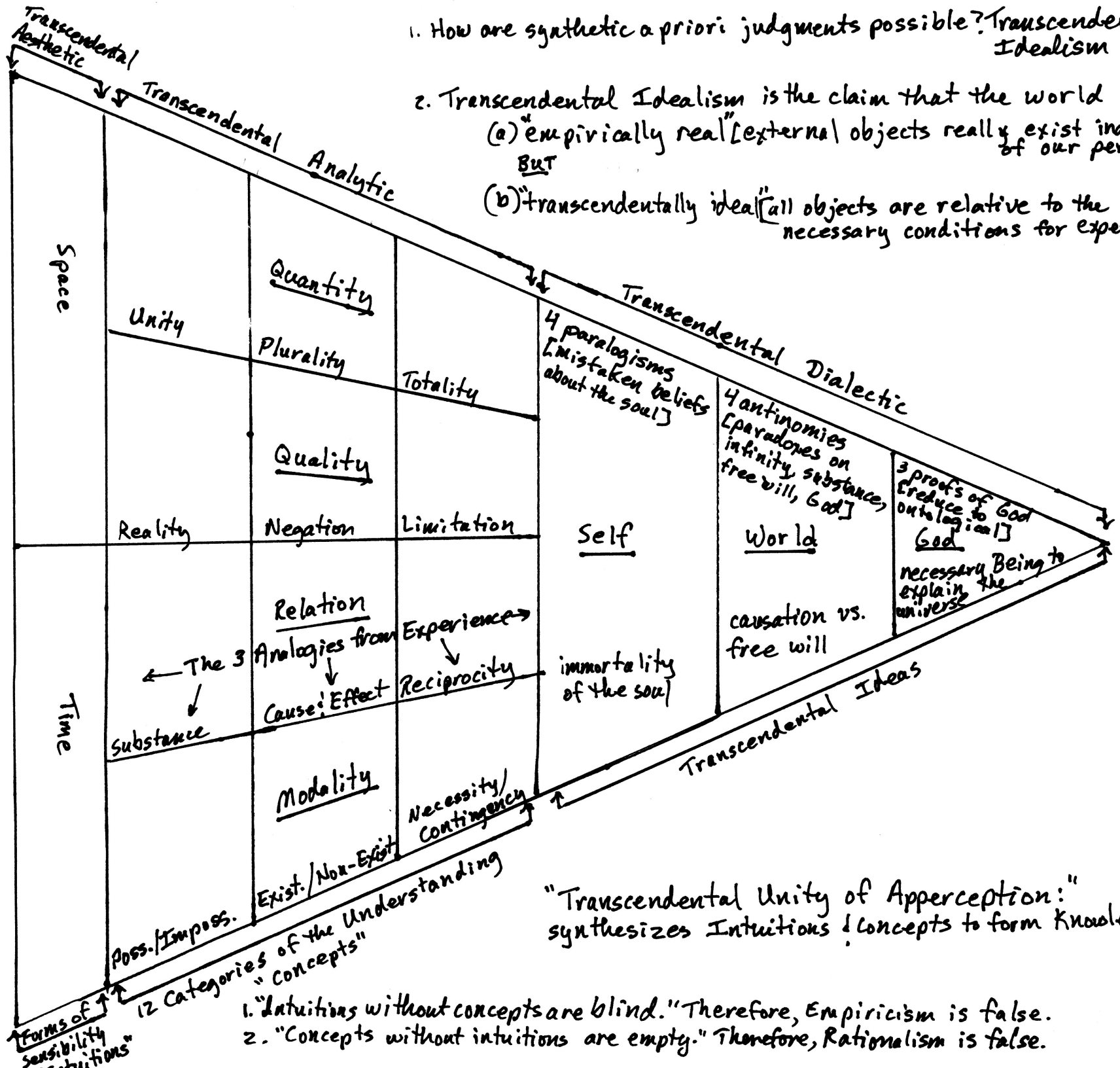


1. How are synthetic a priori judgments possible? Transcendental Idealism

"Transcendental Unity of Apperception:" synthesizes Intuitions & Concepts to form Knowledge

1. "Intuitions without concepts are blind." Therefore, Empiricism is false.
2. "Concepts without intuitions are empty." Therefore, Rationalism is false.
